Responsibilities

Involves analytical studies on a variety of policies, projects, programs and issues in support of a function, research initiative, program and / or organizational unit, or in research of new or changing systems and programs. Assists in policy and program planning, development, administration, management and implementation; interprets, monitors and analyzes information regarding policies and procedures and provides consultative services to department administrators and other stakeholders.

- Work with the Foundation's Global RH team on a range of activities, largely focused on Africa, but also including global advocacy and innovation - including conducting secondary research and analysis on topics to inform grant making and strategy development, and contributing to assessments of grantee organizations.
- Assist with the monitoring, evaluation, and learning activities associated with the Global RH strategy, such as theory of action refinement, compilation of grantee outcomes and indicators, and creation of program dashboards.
- Complete grant summaries and contribute to grant portfolio reviews.
- Provide project management support to the director and program officer, including preparation of
